

Riverton (West Berlin)Cemetery
Berlin, Vermont

The Riverton Cemetery is on Route 12 about halfway between Montpelier and Northfield. It is in the West Berlin section known as Riverton. It is a private cemetery whose records are at present in the hands of Attorney Norbert Towne, who is supposed to be readying deeds, etc to turn the cemetery over to the Town.

This is a pleasant cemetery which drops off on three sides to a field and the Dog River. There are trees and shrubs and some interesting old stones, along the front facing the road is a series of granite posts at one time connected by chains, There appear to be two drives the front to the back. Stones have been listed from left to right starting at the left from of cemetery. I have made notations where there are trees and bushes.

Note. The Cemetery is now under the jurisdiction of the Berlin Cemetery Commission whose members are named by the Selectboard and are provided a budget to maintain this cemetery and all of the other historical cemeteries in the Town. New granite posts and chain were installed in the mid 1990's together with a sign identifying the cemetery.
