

Berlin Pond



Berlin Pond is a natural area for nesting loons, migratory birds, and other wildlife. It is a place of renewal for many central Vermonters who enjoy its quiet beauty. Walkers, joggers, cyclists, bird watchers, kayakers, and fishermen all enjoy this special place. In 1999 the Audubon Society designated Berlin Pond an “Important Bird Area”. Berlin Pond is the drinking water source for Montpelier, Central Vermont Hospital, and part of Berlin.

Allowed uses: non-motorized boating, boats with electric motors, fishing, swimming.

Fishing regulation: Largemouth and Smallmouth bass – catch and release only. Yellow perch – limit of 10 daily.

Currently the only access is on Mirror Lake Road at the southern end of the pond at the culvert. The City of Montpelier owns a majority of the land surrounding the pond and has prohibited access across its property.
